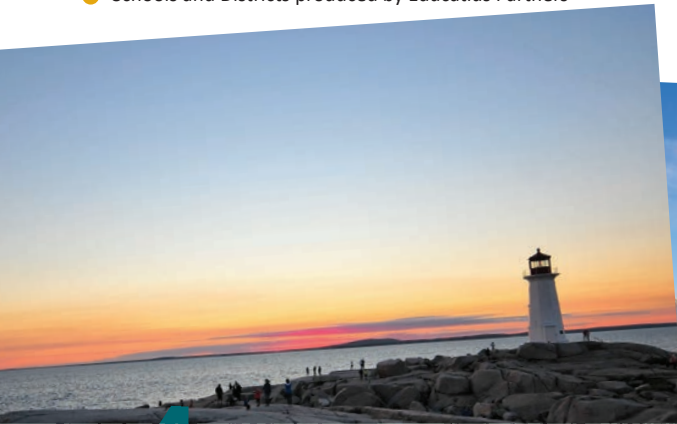
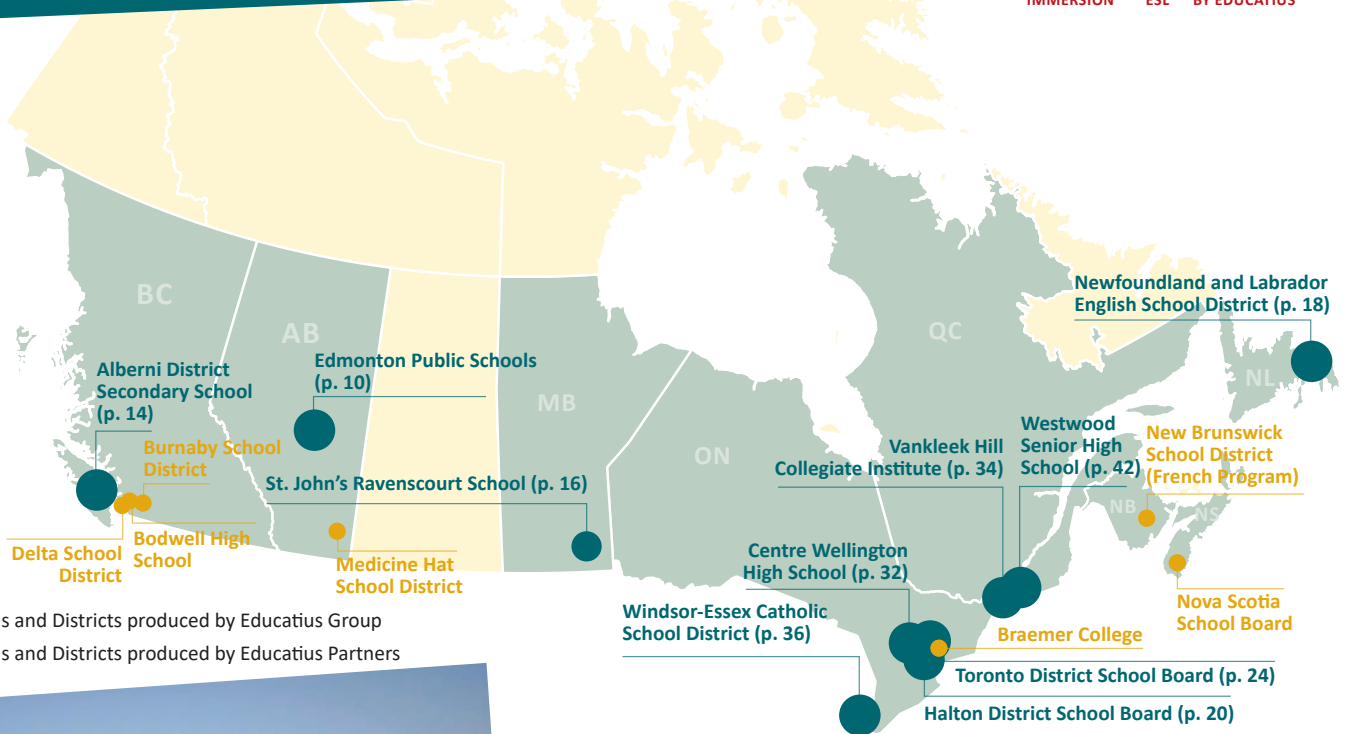

SPECIALTY PROGRAMS

Academies and Specialty Programs are fantastic ways for students to pursue their passions while keeping up with their academics.

Sports Academies

Sports Academies allow students to pursue athletic futures while completing their academic studies. Academies typically provide students with high-level coaching, practice and game opportunities, strength and conditioning training and theory, nutrition education, sports psychology, and post-secondary planning. Students will also have the opportunity to participate in competition while studying, as seasons permit.

French Immersion Programs

As one of Canada's official languages, learning French can provide students with incredible opportunities.

French Immersion programs are an excellent way for students to develop their French language skills. Not only do they learn French as a subject, but French serves as the language of instruction in two or more other subjects. Many students accumulate 10 credits in French — four ESL language courses and six other subjects with French instruction. Upon completion, some schools allow students to graduate with a bilingual certificate, which can be a huge benefit for students applying to college or seeking employment!

Skill-Specific Programs in Canada

Skill-specific programs give students the opportunity to gain experience in a particular field. Whether a student wants to move on to an apprenticeship, job, or university studies, these can be highly beneficial for them, allowing them to develop work skills and habits, explore careers, and even obtain training or certification.

These programs are available throughout Canada. In Ontario, for example, the **Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM)** program allows students in Grades 11 and 12 to explore areas like Business, Environmental Studies, and Sports.

EXAMPLE: ECO STUDIES SPECIALIST HIGH SKILLS MAJOR (SHSM) AT ALDERSHOT SCHOOL — HALTON DISTRICT SCHOOL BOARD, ONTARIO

For students who want to pursue a career in environmental science and the outdoors, the Specialist High Skills Major in ECO Studies at Aldershot School in Ontario's Halton District School Board is the place to start!

What it Entails: Students in this program will study environmental science, Earth science, and geography, and will learn valuable things such as survival skills, outdoor cooking, navigation, and first aid. Outside of the classroom, students will spend three afternoons per week at the Royal Botanical Gardens Nature Interpretive Centre. Best yet, students will still be able to play sports and be part of other extracurricular activities — the best of both worlds!

There will also be three adventure trips during the semester such as:

- A three-day, 45km hiking trip
- A five-day canoe trip to Killarney or Algonquin Provincial Parks
- A three-day camping trip to the Bruce Peninsula National Park

Many students want to study at a Canadian high school, but fear that they don't have the English level necessary to do so. We have good news — we have schools that provide ESL (English as a Second Language instruction) for *all* students! You can find them by looking for the  icon.

Certain Canada SELECT high schools provide support to students with every level of English. Students' English proficiency will be assessed prior to — or immediately after — school acceptance. Students with a high level of English will enter classes without ESL support; all other students will receive an individualized study course plan that is tailored to their needs.

Students will be in an environment where they'll be able to improve their English speaking and listening skills quickly. Reading and writing will also be part of these curriculums, and this immersion in the language will help students improve their grasp in all ways. All the while, ESL instruction is centered around language that is relevant to students' education — so they'll be learning terms that are of particular use to what they'll be studying.

Ultimately, the aim is to have students comfortable enough speaking English to be in mainstream classes without support. Until they reach that point, however, we'll be sure that they receive the support that they need.

OUR SERVICE PROMISE

Taking the utmost care of the international students — from start to finish.

At Educatius Group, we care about the well-being of all of our students, and we want to make sure that they have the best experience possible. With that in mind, our Service Promise is a service-level promise that we've implemented for the Canada High School programs produced by Educatius Group. 

Educatius Group staff will provide:

- *A fast, clear admissions process for applying to schools*

The host family provides a safe and supportive living environment, 3 healthy meals per day, and arrangement of transportation to and from school and extracurricular activities.

Within the first 30 days, our Student Experience team will pay special attention to ensure that students are well taken care of. For the rest of the stay, students will receive the following support:

- *24/7 toll-free (from within Canada) emergency support +1 800 301 6014*
- *Monthly check-ins from the student's Regional Manager to document a report on the student's academic performance, host family situation, social and cultural adjustment, and overall progress*
- *On-going support from the Student Experience team to each student on school, host family, or other social life issues*
