Academic Benefits of the F-1 Program

Enjoy some of the best academic opportunities and facilities in the USA!

AP Courses

Advanced Placement (AP) courses are equivalent to a first-year university course, great for students who want to challenge themselves in a particular subject. Plus, they give you a fast track into higher education!

Public High Schools typically offer AP courses such as Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, English, Spanish, and US History, but some schools even offer specialized AP courses in fields like Art, Computer Science, Economics, Environmental Science, Geography, Latin, Music, and Psychology.

Specialty Programs

Specialty programs cultivate students' unique talents. Since companies like Google and Apple are leaders in innovation, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) curricula are very popular with American students right now. Additionally, some schools have specialty programs in fields like business leadership, multimedia, and performing arts.

Convalidation

Do you need your high school in your home country to formally recognize the courses you have taken in the USA? Not a problem! The credits you earned in the US can be applied to your education back home. Educatus will guide you with the process of convalidating these courses.

Diploma Year Program

Educatus students entering grade 12 can earn a US Diploma in one year, if they pass the required courses. Once graduated from high school, they may then apply to an American university, assisted by the school's college counselor or Educatus College & University Services.

Many graduates of Educatus' Diploma Year Program have successfully gone on to study at US universities. Recent acceptances to top universities in the USA and around the world include Texas A&M University, University of San Diego, State University of New York (SUNY), Boston University, Renmin University (China), University of Milan (Italy), and Frei Berlin University (Germany).

Foreign Languages

Beyond English, many international students interested in studying an additional language can typically choose from Spanish and French. Additionally, some public schools also offer German, Latin, Mandarin Chinese, Russian, Italian, Korean, and Japanese.

Sports and Arts at US Public Schools

Playing Sports

For international students, joining an athletic team doesn't just mean advancing your skills – it's also one of the best ways to build lasting friendships!

Most high schools in the US offer several kinds of teams to join - commonly American football, soccer, basketball, volleyball, track and field, and baseball. Educatus' public schools may also offer specialty sports such as rowing/crew, ice hockey, tennis, golf, swimming, sailing, skiing, eSports, and equestrian (horseback riding). Many boast outstanding, state-of-the-art athletic facilities.

Sports are divided into seasons — fall, winter, and spring — which can vary from school to school. Students who want to study for a semester and play a sport should check that school's list of sports during the semester they will be attending.

SPORTS RESTRICTIONS


A few states have restrictions on international students playing sports at public schools. Depending on the state, that might mean that students in grade 12 cannot participate (Arizona and California). In other states, students may be allowed to practice with the team, but cannot compete until a 1-month waiting period has passed. Many states like Massachusetts have no restrictions at all.

The girls on my golf team were the first American friends I made and even though the season is over I'm still close to them! Some of the things I'll remember the most from this year are: those spontaneous trips to the beach; school lunches at nearby coffee; walking around with my golf team in our team-shirts on match days; football games under the stadium lights; cheering at intense basketball games; and wearing my senior shirt on rally days at school. Arts Classes

All US Public Schools offer art classes as part of the regular curriculum, letting students earn credit as they develop their talents.

The range of art courses available are almost as varied as the number of public schools! Virtually every public school has an art option (band, choir, painting, theater), with some offering an even larger portfolio of choices - for instance Multimedia, Broadcast Journalism, Classical Dance, Television Production, Orchestra, Film-making, Acting, 3D Design, Ceramics, Photography, Sculpture, and Song Writing.

My High School Experience in the USA

“Enjoy every moment like it is your last.” That was my motto this past year. For many students, the school year was just another school year. But this year was my dream experience I always wished for. My name is Emma, and I am an international student from Austria and spent ten months at Oak Park High School in California.

Over the past year, I have changed a lot. I wouldn't say completely changed - I just improved. First of all, like any other teenager, I grew quite a bit. When I first got here, I was around 5' 7" and currently my height is almost 5' 9." What I also noticed over the past month is that my eyes have changed. That might sound weird, but it seems to me that a sparkle developed in my eyes, the blue is brighter now. As my host grandmother, Bubby, said to me, “Emma, your style has matured over the past few months.” The style in the USA, especially in Southern California, is way different than what I am used too.

I think the biggest change I have experienced is socially. My entire social life changed. As mentioned before, in Austria, my family includes my mother, my father, my sister, and my brother. Both my siblings are younger, which means I did not know what to expect this past year. Not only did this program give me great opportunities to broaden my horizon, but also changed the circle of people around me, for example my host family!





This year I was lucky to live in California with an incredible host family. They were welcoming and treated me like family. Unlike my family back home, my roles switched. I was the baby of the family! I also made new friends. I can't even mention all the people I met this year and whom I became friends with. There are many people I am honored to call my friends from basketball, theater, or other international students.

Also, my motivation has changed. I never wanted to stay at home this year, instead I went out and experienced new things. This year has taught me to enjoy and live every moment. Since I got here, I knew my time was limited, so my chance of meeting people was shorter. As an exchange student you make new acquaintances almost daily and you have a limited chance to become close with everyone. If you do, they will always have a special place in your heart. My circle of friends grew. When I go back to Austria, I can say there are many people on the other side of the world that care about me and I can call family.

Starting my journey my Local Coordinator said, "even though these ten months will seem so short and are just a small part of your life, it will have an impact on your future." She was totally right! This experience has inspired me to travel and live all around the world. I want to explore different places, meet new people, and learn about their cultures. I will participate in, hopefully, more studying abroad programs. In the far future, I want to give my children the same great opportunity as I had. This year has shown me how precious every moment is and that it is our responsibility to live it to the fullest.

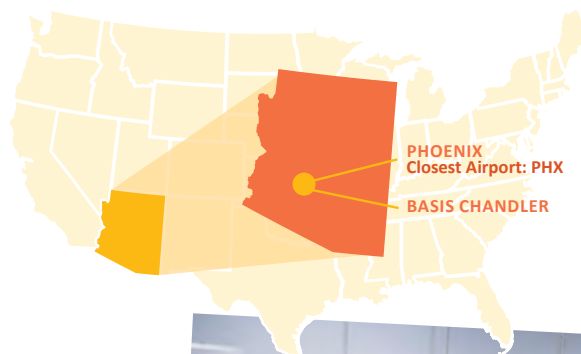

STEP 1

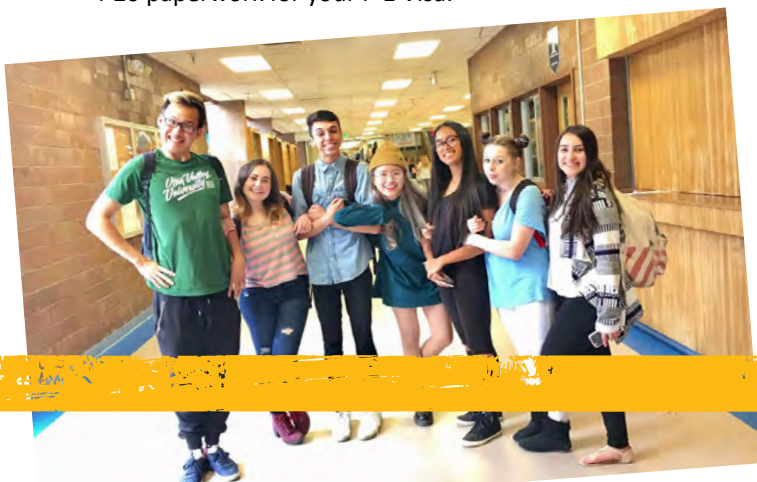

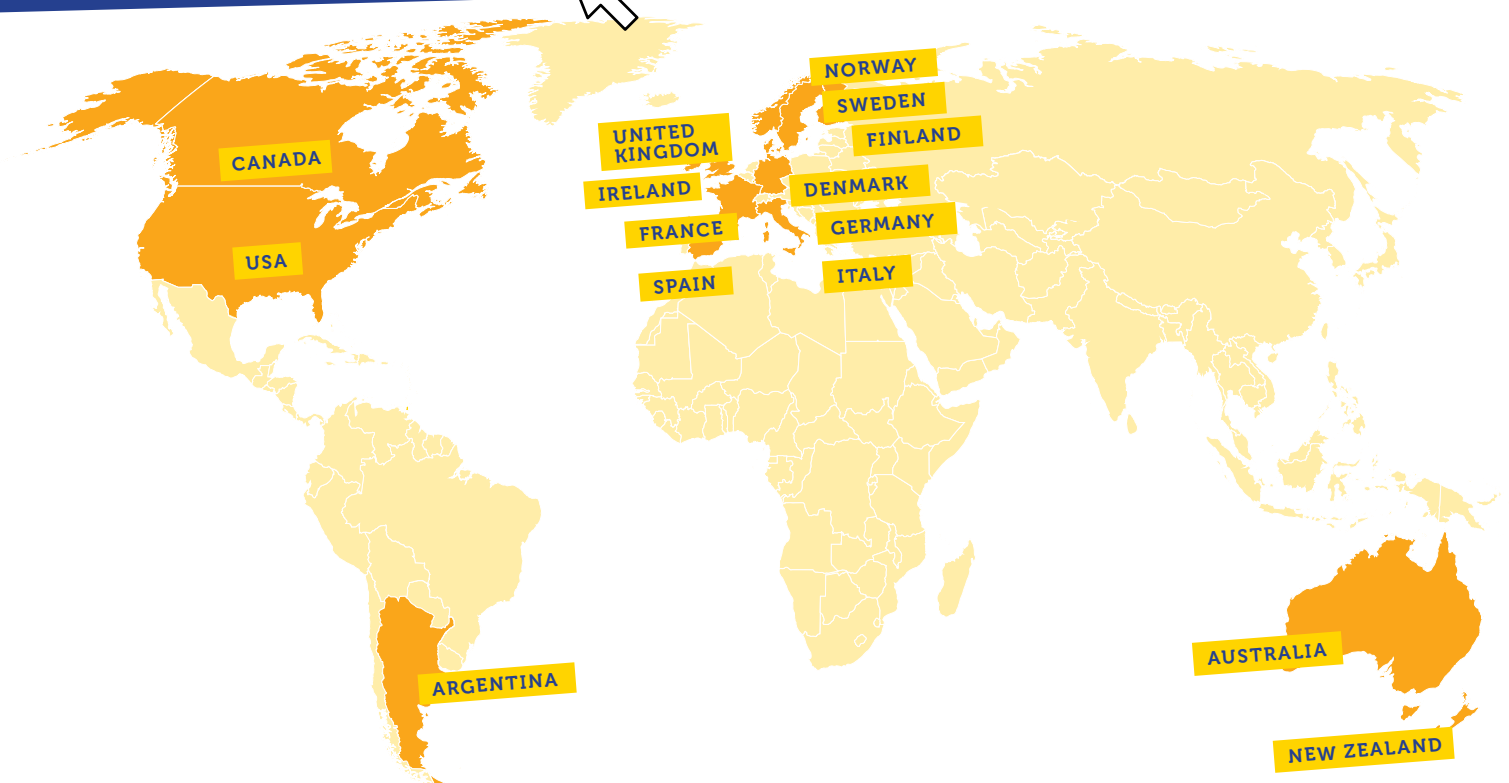
